TO KNOW:

1. Social and economic questions of traumatism;
2. Frequency and causes of injuries and diseases of locomotor system;

5. Terms of immobilization at injuries and orthopedic diseases;

2. Diagnose urgent states at injuries and provide medical care to patients with fractures on prehospital stage;
3. Do temporary stop of external bleeding;
4. Do anesthesia in area of fracture of long bone diaphysis;
5. Make transport immobilization at injuries of limbs, spine and pelvis;
6. Perform medical immobilization of limb with simple gypsum bandage;
7. Evaluate the condition of limb in a plaster cast;
8. Remove the plaster cast and skeletal traction.
